- 4. When do I get a copy of the design and elevations?
- 5. Are you full service or do I need to hire my own contractors?
- 6. If I want to buy my own materials will you install them? How does this process work?
- 7. Will you act as the general contractor and run the entire job from start to finish? If so, what is included?
- 8. How long will the project take from start to finish? How soon will you start after a deposit is received?
- 9. How long have your crews been working with you? Does each crew have a designated supervisor that also works on the job?
- 10. Do you, as the bathroom designer, visit the jobsite once the project begins and continue through its duration?
- 11. How are the payments structured?
- 12. Can we see pictures of your work or visit homes of previous clients?

- 13. Do you have references and/or testimonials?
- 14. What items or materials should I consider incorporating into my bathroom that will also help with resale?
- 15. Do you help with material selections and finishes?
